SERVICE AREAS

NEWCOMER AND RELOCATION SUPPORT

We ensure each member and their family is supported through their move to and from Winnipeg. We are able to offer information and make referrals based on your family's specific needs. From the reception of your posting message to your departure or arrival, each family will be supported through their move and resettlement. One of the many services for arriving personnel and their families is the Family Sponsor Program. It is designed to help members and their families have an easier and faster transition into the Winnipeg community.

DEPLOYMENT SUPPORT

Anytime a CAF member is away from home (on course, training, overseas deployment or basic training), we offer supports and services to help cope with the many challenges that may arise before, during and after the work related separation. This includes deployment and reunion family briefings, pre- and post deployment planning sessions, welcome home bags, parcel packing station, stress free child care, resource library, and deployment and reunion programs and activities on a regular basis. The Road to Mental Readiness (R2MR) program is offered through group programs as well as one-on-one sessions for families.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

The MFRC Volunteer Program seeks to foster an environment of personal growth, volunteer development, and community engagement with the military community. We actively encourage volunteers from our community to work together with our staff to provide military families with programs and services to promote health, education and social well-being. Volunteers enhance the capability of the Winnipeg MFRC to provide timely, effective, eco-

participation, we can draw upon the extensive resources and skills available within our community. Our volunteers are made up of youth, adults and seniors, and come from both military and civilian families.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES AND EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

The employment and education service provided to military family members is available to assist with career planning, networking strategies, interview skills, resume development, job search skills as well as workshops including LinkedIn 101, the Better Business Bureau LIFT ethics in the workplace and the Telfer Entrepreneurship training. We also offer an employment support group each week for spouses to come together and chat, network and participate in training, presentations and visits to employers and educational establishments in a supportive group setting. Other events throughout the year include on-line workshop opportunities with Military Family Services and the annual Learning and Career Fair each Fall.

RESERVE OUTREACH

The Reserve Outreach Coordinator ensures Manitoba & Northwest Ontario Reserve Units are linked with MFRC resources. This includes briefing each unit about how the MFRC can assist members and their families. When services are required in locations outside of Winnipeg we ensure these families are supported to the best of our abilities. The Reserve Outreach Coordinator also provides information and referrals.

MENTAL HEALTH - PREVENTION, SUPPORT AND INTERVENTION

Our social workers understand the military lifestyle and can help you access services available, both within the military community and in the broader Winnipeg community. We offer prevention and education workshops, aimed at maintaining and enhancing family mental health and well-being. Should a concern arise about family, parenting, relationships, communication or just a need for someone to talk to, we also offer free, confidential, short-term counselling for adults and play-based counselling for children.

FAMILY LIAISON OFFICER

The MFRC Family Liaison Officer (FLO) offers social work services in the form of direct counselling, information and comprehensive referral services for families of physically/psychologically ill/injured CAF members. This service is co-located with other service providers (Veterans Affairs, OSISS) at the Integrated Personnel Support Centre (IPSC). Services are available on a drop-in basis or by appointment. Off-base appointments and home visits are available upon request. This service is free of charge and confidential.

VETERAN FAMILY PROGRAM

The transition from military life to a civilian one means a lot of changes. These changes affect not only military members, but also their families. We are here with support, referrals and programs to help all new and current veterans and their families navigate this transition. Contact our program coordinator early in your transition.

CHILD CARE INFORMATION

It is always the parents responsibility to interview and ensure their children's safety and experience when choosing child care. Our listing services are not screened.

COMMUNITY CHILD CARE OPTIONS

In Manitoba, child care providers are either licensed or unlicensed. Licensed providers must follow the Community Child Care Standards Act as set out by the provincial government and are evaluated regularly. Unlicensed providers may meet the standards, but are not monitored by the province. There is a provincial on-line child care registry to facilitate finding and applying for licensed child care in Manitoba. ARE YOU LOOKING FOR CHILD CARE OR A BABY SITTER?

The MFRC compiles and updates a "Community Child Care Providers" listing, which is available by stopping by the MFRC during regular office hours. Listings include: community child care listings; long term child care services; extended hour child care resources; and the babysitters list.

ARE YOU A CHILD CARE PROVIDER OR A BABY SITTER?

We are looking for community members who operate a family home daycare or provide casual child care services (including teen babysitting) to add to our Community Child Care Providers listing. All we need is an 8.5" X 11" advertisement describing your service (be sure to include hours of operation, location, snacks, etc.)

STRESS FREE CHILD CARE

This service is for when a CAF member is deployed or frequently absent. For every 30 days that the member is away(consecutively or accumulated over a period of 90 days), the family is eligible to receive \$30 in Stress Free Child Care funds (available to use at the MFRC Occasional Child Care Centre (OCC)or to have supplementary child care at your own convenience). In addition, deployed families will also receive a voucher for free casual care at the OCC for each child (ages 6 mos - 12 years). Deployed families also have priority for evening and weekend child care at the OCC with registration 2 weeks in advance.

To qualify for this program, a Family Contact Form must be filled out at the MFRC and must be accompanied by "tasking orders" that include the dates that the member will be away.

EMERGENCY CHILD CARE SERVICES

On occasion, life presents an unexpected situation that disrupts our normal routine and resources. The MFRC can assist when certain circumstances hinder access to your usual child care arrangements and/or allow sufficient time to implement your established Family Care Plan (DND form 2886). The MFRC assesses emergency and respite needs and eligibility on a case-by-case basis. If supported, the MFRC may subsidize a family's emergency child care request through direct child care services, expense reimbursement or through the coordination of independent child care services on a short term basis.

Emergency Child Care is available 24/7. During regular business hours please contact the MFRC at 204-833-2500 ext 4500. After hour emergency child care assistance is provided by Complete Care who can be reached at 204-949-5090. The fees for after hour care through Complete Care may be eligible for reimbursement.

CHILD CARE SERVICES

MFRC CHILDCARE CENTRE

The MFRC Childcare Centre is a provincially regulated and licensed child care facility for children between the ages of six months and 12 years. We offer full-time care from 0630 to 1730 Monday to Friday. Programs include: Short and long term infant care; Toddler; Preschool; Kinder Care and School Age. DROP-IN CHILD SUPERVISION FOR CHILDREN AGES 18 MONTHS TO 5 YEARS OLD.

The Winnipeg MFRC offers Drop-in Child Supervision for parents to access when they remain in the MFRC building (102 Comet St.) for the duration of care. This allows you to participate in programs, access our library and computers and volunteer. Look for the indicating programs that have child supervision available.

Drop-in Child Supervision is offered Tuesday - Friday mornings from 0930 - 1130 and Tuesday - Thursday afternoons -1300 to 1530. Cost is \$2 per family per program. Evening programs that offer this supervision require pre-registration and pre-payment. Prepaid punch cards are available at our front desk. Parents must provide snacks and diapering supplies and appropriate clothing for outside activities.


